Concurrent Enrollment Program

What is Concurrent Enrollment?

The **Cañada College Concurrent Enrollment Program** allows students to enroll in Cañada College courses while they are still in high school. It is designed to provide current high school students, who have completed the 8th grade or higher at the time of entering a course, the opportunity to get an “early start” on their **college experience**. It is open to 9th, 10th, 11th & 12th graders.
