

Parking Policy for Students with Temporary Disabilities

A student with a current DMV (Department of Motor Vehicles) temporary or permanent placard, sticker, or license plate may park in any of Cañada College's parking lots or designated disabled parking spaces (blue zones). You must display your current DMV placard on the dash of your car or hang it on the rear view mirror for easy visibility. **Students with DMV issued handicapped parking permits do not need college issued temporary disability parking permits or student parking permits.**

For temporary ambulatory disabilities, a student may request a temporary college issued disabled parking permit, **valid for up to 6 weeks maximum**, by contacting the Disability Resource Center at (650) 306-3259 or visiting the Center located in Building 5, room 303. **Students with college issued disability parking permits may park in any student or staff/faculty lot on campus. *These permits do not allow students to park in designated handicapped spots and they do not exempt students from paying to park in metered spots.*** Students will need to provide written and current documentation of the disability from their treating physician and complete a form requesting the special college issued parking permit. Temporary college issued disability parking permits are approved for short term ambulatory disabilities such as broken legs, sprained ankles, torn ligaments, etc.

Students must have a valid [Cañada College student parking permit](#), even if they are provided a college issued temporary disability parking permit. Both need to be prominently displayed on the dash or rear view mirror of your automobile in order to avoid receiving a parking citation.

College issued permits are only valid at Cañada College and are not a substitute for a DMV issued placard. Anyone with a permanent disability or chronic health condition requiring special parking should apply for disabled parking at the DMV.
