Third in family to attend Middle College


Competes on high school wrestling team

THE BASICS

All classes are taught at Cañada College

3 required **high school classes** in the afternoon

2-4 regular **college classes** in the morning, evening, or online

Goals: Completion of SUHSD diploma requirements, A-G college eligibility requirements, & any college prerequisites

Outcomes: Preparation for transfer-level college work, completion of a year of college credit, & greater level of responsibility for education



HIGH SCHOOL CLASSES

12:30-3:05 daily

All students take college prep English and social studies, plus a required elective, College and Career Readiness.

COLLEGE CLASSES



Students may take any college class for which they are qualified.

Advisors help students choose classes that fulfill requirements based on each student's needs and goals, releasing control as student understands system more

Students will have different schedules each semester, based on their college courses.

Students have unscheduled time during the day to study, meet with tutors, attend office hours with instructors, and take part in campus activities.

College classes are not modified in any way for Middle College students; they are held to the same course expectations as all other college students.

If you need a lot of extrinsic motivation (parents, teachers, school rules) to help you succeed

If you struggle academically in your current high school classes because you find the material and reading challenging

Applying to highly selective colleges and wanted to be prepared for college experience


Austin -- focus on athletics, prep for major

Already earned one Associate's Degree; will earn three more by the time she graduates from high school


Addy -- save time and money
