Updates on OER/ZTC in the District

- WebSchedule: Thanks to the huge lift by Nick to get the DE icons/descriptions on WebSchedule changed, we have an opportunity to get the OER icons/descriptions changed. This already went through our local Academic Senates and the District Academic Senate, so we're ready to get this done. The OER Leads on all 3 campuses are just cleaning up final wording and getting an icon or two reworked, but this should be done in the next week. While it will be green-lit for Spring 2021, the real goal is to have everything fully in-place before Summer 2021 registration starts.
- Grants
  - The OER Leads on all 3 campuses worked with the Promise Scholar Program Leads on each campus to go for a federal grant: OER Test Pilot Program. We just missed that deadline, but we're looking to use that report to apply for different grants at all levels.
  - The goal would be to get grant money to use to encourage adoption and remix/reuse at our campuses.
    - Skyline would take the lead, but Cañada would work very closely in coordination. (CSM is behind us, but would benefit from the work.)
    - Remix/reuse particularly for higher-level courses (especially STEM) and ancillaries—which is what our faculty are asking for.
  - LibreText collaboration—there are avenues for this, so we'll explore those options, too

# **Textbook Affordability Subcommittee Goals, Responsibilities, and Membership**

## **DRAFT 24 November 2020**

### **Goals**

- In a given term, 75% of courses/sections would be OER-converted (ZCT, Low-Cost, No-Textbook<sup>1</sup>);
- Develop a repository of permanent campus-wide resources;
- Develop partnerships with transfer institutions/programs (through Curriculum);
- Create a program of incentives for all instructors to put their materials in the public domain, including adoption of low-cost materials and ZCT.

### **Responsibilities**

- Evangelize and educate on the use of OER, including new advances in OER (e.g. Rice);
- Encourage adoption of OER and sharing of materials across disciplines;
- Work with faculty to include OER in the COR for their courses, ensuring the rigor is appropriate for the course;
- Distribute the resources across the campus community;
- Work with OER partners at CSM/SKY;
- Report out to ASGC and other participatory governance bodies.
