Open Education Week 2026: 2-6 March

The Textbook Affordability Solutions Workgroup (TASW) organized a number of events to celebrate all things open. We celebrated all things open education with a number of events, including a powerful keynote conversation with Prof. Tiffany Lanoix of West Los Angeles College, who is the OERI's IDEA Framework Lead. - Cañada Library's OE Week Interactive Exhibit (all week)
- A student voice Padlet and a faculty voice Padlet to collect thoughts on the impact of ZTC and LTC courses
- Cañada's ZTC Team showcased to students, faculty, staff and the community the power of OER and other ZTC methods in the Grove!
- State of ZTC (2 March, 12-1pm): As is tradition, we caught everyone up on what's been happening at Skyline College, College of San Mateo and Cañada College with respect to ZTC/LTC courses. We discussed how we have been managing our funding from the state to create new pathways and the new professional development trainings happening on our campuses.

- Opening Doors: Skyline College Faculty Talk about Using Affordable Course Materials (2 March, 2-3pm): Skyline College faculty who teach with OER and ZTC materials shared their motivations for choosing affordable course materials, the challenges and surprises they encounter, and the impact on learning experiences in their courses.
- NotebookLM and AI: Expanding your OERs (4 March, 11am-12pm): NotebookLM, the powerful study tool through Google that is powered by Gemini, is the perfect tool to create more ways for students to interact with OER and Open Access materials. This interactive session was run by July Díaz (one of CSM's Instructional Designers) and Tamara Perkins (Film Studies faculty at CSM).
- Doing Dangerous Work: The ASCCC IDEA Framework (4 March, 12-1pm): The keynote conversation for SMCCCD's OpenEd Week events focused on the [IDEA Framework](#) with Prof. Tiffany Lanoix of the ASCCC Open Educational Resources Initiative (OERI). Prof. Lanoix unpacked what IDEA (Inclusion, Diversity, Equity, and Anti-racism) means in the context of educational resources and why OER are especially powerful for this work, since open licenses allow faculty to revise materials to better reflect their community contexts.
- Student Voice: Fall 2025 District-wide Affordable Instructional Materials Student Survey (6 March, 12-1pm): With 600+ responses, the district-wide survey that was run in Fall 2025 gave us important information about how our students feel about the affordability of instructional materials, whether they are in ZTC/LTC courses or not. Join us for a robust discussion of what the students are telling us and ways that we can address their needs.

Reminder about Textbook Adoptions and SB 893

- ***Make sure to get your Summer and Fall Textbook Adoptions into Jai (and Sarah for ZTC/LTC) on time!***
 - Summer adoptions are due on 10 March 2026.
 - Fall adoptions are due on 10 April 2026.
- SB 893, the legislation that allows the District to fund the Free College Initiative, has specific restrictions with respect to how students in the program can purchase their course materials.
 - SB 893 textbook funds are **only** available for materials that can be purchased through the college bookstore.
 - SB 893 covers textbook costs for students who show financial need and/or who are eligible for the non-resident tuition waiver.
- The more courses and sections that are converted to ZTC or LTC, the further these dollars can go!
 - If you're using ZTC materials—especially those that are open-source—you can make a print option copy available. That way, your students can use their financial aid funds to purchase that print copy. Ask Jai for more info!

 - a. Updated [Cañada ZTC Course Conversion Professional Development Plan](#) (view-only link), based on the work of TASW in response to required changes. This work was started in Fall 2025 and finalized by TASW in terms of the types of activities and amount of compensation.
 - b. Required updates:
 - i. Each college's ZTC program is required to switch to an hourly-based compensation

model (paid by special rate) to comply with Payroll practices and reporting to CalPERS/CalSTRS.

- ii. TASW agreed upon maximum caps on hours for certain types of activities and training to help with budgeting.
 - iii. TASW agreed on the training modules for micro-courses and courses, including college- and district-specific Canvas courses and external training courses.
 - iv. TASW agreed on time ranges for remixing, adaptation and authoring projects, with the last one being funded through grant applications.
- c. Overall unveiling of the new district-wide agreements will come during Open Education Week's SMCCCD Kick-off event.
 - d. TAS: Make comments in the [edit-allowable link](#) (Track Changes enabled) before March's meeting. (Sarah will also present it to Academic Senate, PDPC and IPC.)
