 - From the Summer 2025 cohort, the COMM 130 remix with Canvas shell (Prof. John Perez) is still being worked on but should be completed very soon. Prof. Nick Tuttle had to pull out of the cohort for his remix of PSYC 200.
- Going forward, the ZTC Adopter Program will run in Summer only. We're working on aligning training
 across the district and moving to an hour-based (not award-based) compensation. More news on this in
 the Spring.

CCCCO ZTC Grant Updates

- General CCCCO Grant funding
 - We've used our Implementation Grant funding to widen our zero-cost GE pathway (based on the Cal-GETC pattern) and made the Communication Studies 2.0 AA-T, Early Childhood Education AA-T and Math AS-T all to zero-cost!
 - We're using our 2025 ZTC Allocation funds to continue this planning and tracking work with the OER/ZTC Program Manager's position. Most of the work is outreach to faculty and campus partnerships to document much of the work that's already being done.
- Digital Art and Animation Acceleration II Grant
 - Prof. Emanuela Quaglia has completed her new OER text for MART 362: Introduction to Digital Photography. Congratulations!
 - We're working with the Bookstore to set up a fund for students who take MART 379
 (Introduction to Digital Animation) synchronously so that they can purchase the low-cost
 software that's needed for the course. (Students in the hybrid sections already have access in
 the computer labs.)
- ECE/English with Digital Literacy Acceleration Grant
 - All ECE courses in this sequence have now been converted to ZTC!
 - Prof. Anna Mills has completed her OER text on digital literacy: <u>AI and College Writing: An Orientation</u>, and is putting the finishing touches on a Canvas module and a few exercises in ADAPT. Stay tuned!
- Math with Equity- and Competency-Based Grading Practices Acceleration Grant
 - o Work is coming along, with a more detailed progress report coming later this semester.

Reminder about Textbook Adoptions and SB 893

- Make sure to get your Spring Textbook Adoptions into Jai (and Sarah for ZTC/LTC) as soon as
 possible! Technically, they're due on 10 October (or there abouts), but we need them as soon as
 possible to update WebSchedule and the Bookstore's records.
- SB 893, the legislation that allows the District to fund the Free College Initiative, has specific restrictions with respect to how students in the program can purchase their course materials.
 - SB 893 textbook funds are *only* available for materials that can be purchased through the college bookstore.
 - SB 893 covers textbook costs for students who show financial need and/or who are eligible for the non-resident tuition waiver.
- The more courses and sections that are converted to ZTC or LTC, the further these dollars can go!
 - If you're using ZTC materials—especially those that are open-source—you can make a print option copy available. That way, your students can use their financial aid funds to purchase that print copy. Ask Jai for more info!

New FAQ: <u>Al Attribution and Citations for OER</u> offers guidance on citing Al-generated content, addressing copyright concerns, and encouraging transparent and ethical Al use in OER. The FAQ is a "living document" that currently offers guidance on citing Al-generated content, clarifies copyright implications, provides advice on handling inaccuracies, and stresses the importance of transparency and responsible Al use in academic and creative work

Today more than ever there is an urgency to embrace language teaching practices that are both inclusive and equitable. This interactive presentation will examine the outcomes of our efforts to foster diverse pedagogical and curricular approaches to enhance student learning, encourage critical-thinking, and ultimately promote and celebrate diversity, equity, and inclusion. More specifically, presenters will address the challenges and opportunities arising from fostering inclusivity in Spanish language instruction, offer strategies to include non-binary Spanish and voseo in the classroom, and share OER aimed at making Spanish language instruction affordable and accessible to effectively accommodate diverse learners and create equitable learning
