Adult CPR/AED and First Aid Training

Skyline College will be hosting an Adult CPR/AED and First Aid training on Thursday, April 17, 2025 from 12:30-4:30 p.m. in 6-202 and 6-204. Skyline College has contracted with the American Heart Association to provide the training. The course is open to all district employees and will be capped at 25 participants. Those who are interested can register at: <https://forms.gle/ka9SPdhrsPSuKKKo7>. The Adult First Aid/CPR/AED course incorporates

the latest science and teaches students to recognize and care for a variety of first aid emergencies such as burns, cuts, scrapes, sudden illnesses, head, neck, back injuries, heat and cold emergencies and how to respond to breathing and cardiac emergencies for victims about 12 years and older. Successful students will receive a certificate for Adult First Aid/CPR/AED valid for two years.
