Designing Your Syllabus

- Apply accessibility best practices to create accessible syllabus documents
- Using a welcoming and inclusive tone
- Place emphasis on student learning
- Supportive and understanding course policies
- Make instructions and expectations clear regarding activities and assignments
- Use first person and positive language to increase approachability
- Include your contact information, preferred method of contact, and anticipated response times
- Address a wide range of language skills as you write content (e.g. spell acronyms, define terms, avoid or define jargon)
- Regularly reviewing our syllabi for updates in language, policies and tone, as well as content
