- Status: Space finished; furniture installed; already in student use as a study hub.
- Who it serves: Primarily first-gen, low-income STEM students (MESA). Collaborations welcome when MESA students are included (state VAR reporting requires tracking student usage/costs).
- Programming/Partners:
 - o **TRIO workshops**: time management, stress, study skills.
 - Stanford MOU: District can pay MESA students for lab internships; planned mentor training (context on student backgrounds & impostor syndrome) and application/letter-writing workshop—recommend Writing Center partnership.
 - Clubs: CS, Robotics, Chem, Math. Robotics building a trash-picking robot; 3D printing often on Fridays (Mon–Thu mostly study hours).
- Space use: Keep it a student space. Events with non-MESA students possible only when MESA
 participation is clear (for compliance). Cultural Center offered a space-request framework; potential joint
 project (3D-printed culturally relevant keychains) if supplies are covered.
