- Year 1 starts Fall 2021 (full Guided Pathway implementation)
 - Interest Areas
 - Human Behavior & Culture
 - Art, Design & Performance
 - Business
 - Science & Health
 - Success Teams: to align student support programs with academic pathways
 - 1 team per interest area
 - May comprise of: Dean, counselor, retention specialist, program services coordinator, peer mentors (students), and data coach
 - Will help with:
 - Onboarding and matriculation
 - Retention and persistence
 - Completion of education goals
 - First-year experience
 - As of fall 2021, all freshmen (first-time students) at Cañada College will participate in a First Year Experience program that includes a series of events and activities during which they will learn about the College, engage with fellow students and faculty in their Interest Areas, understand how academic pathways lead to careers and how they can explore their options during their first year as a college student. Career workshops, social events, and other activities during their first year will help students feel connected and that they know their way around the College.

o COLTS-CON

- COLTS-CON is a FREE program designed to improve college skills and prepare new, continuing, and STEM students for their next semester at Cañada College. The program features various online activities designed to enrich each student's college readiness whether they are in their first semester or their fourth semester.
 - At COLTS-CON students will:
 - Meet new friends who are taking the same classes
 - Explore college life with fun online activities

- Build connections with faculty, staff, peer mentors (students), and supportive campus programs
- Learn how to pay for college, find support on campus, and learn skills to master their classes
- The online activities are led by faculty and staff from programs across the campus, and each activity will team up students that are taking similar classes with peer mentors that can share their own experiences and tips about how to navigate the challenges of community college.
- The whole week is designed to build the skills and connections students need to have a rich, successful experience at Cañada college.
