

### MoneySaver

**DECISION #2** We are talking with our daughter about us paying to renovate and expand her home so we can move in with her and her family. Should we do this?

**THIS CAN BE** a great arrangement, says Rosanne Rogé, a financial planner in Bohemia, New York. "But there are personal and financial issues to think through in advance," she says.

• **Tackle the personal issues first.** Have an open, detailed conversation with your child and her spouse about lifestyle: Who will cook? How much babysitting will they expect? What will be your do-not-disturb hours? "It's important to establish boundaries," says Ayla Girovard, a writer at AgingInPlace.org.

• **Then address the finances.** Figure out the cost of renovations. Write down in advance how much you will chip in for maintenance and utilities, Rogé advises. Plan for what will happen if you need care later on. "Your daughter may not want to be your primary caregiver," she says.

• **Finally, settle long-term ownership issues.** Work with an attorney to specify what happens to the house if your daughter dies before you do, says Girovard. And if the home increases in value, will you be reimbursed if your daughter sells and moves?



**DECISION #1** Is it a good idea to take in a boarder or roommate to cut down on my housing expenses?

**YES, AS LONG AS** you take important steps to help avoid unpleasant scenarios such as the renter leaving messes, making noise after hours, causing property damage, not paying or refusing to leave, says Albert Kippes, an attorney, real estate broker and gerontologist in San Francisco. "To protect yourself, be sure to formalize the process," she says.

• **Screen tenants.** Ask potential renters for references and permission to run a background check using their Social Security number, Kippes says.

• **Read your paperwork.** When the major credit reporting agencies Equifax and TransUnion include both credit and criminal record checks. Your community may have roommate services that prescreen renters. "Some colleges have programs that place students with older residents. If there is a college nearby, this can be a great arrangement," Kippes says.

• **Insist on a signed lease.** Detail everything from whether pets are permitted, how many visitors are allowed at one time, where parking is permitted, when rent is due and how much time the renter will have to vacate if things don't work out.
