## Assistant Teacher Permit

- ECE 210, ECE 212
- No Work Experience Required \*\*



## Associate Teacher Permit

- ECE 210, ECE 212, ECE 211, ECE 201
- 50 days of work experience, paid or volunteer \*\*



## Teacher Permit

- ECE 210, ECE 212, ECE 211, ECE 201, ECE 254, ECE 313, ECE 333, ECE 366
- 16 General Education (GE) units with at least one course in each of these four categories: English/Language Arts (CSU A-2); Math or Science (CSU B-1, B-2, B-4); Social Sciences (CSU D); Humanities or Fine Arts (CSU C-1, C-2) \*
- 175 days of work experience, paid or volunteer \*\*



## Master Teacher Permit

- ECE & GE units necessary to qualify for the Teacher Permit
  - Plus 6 ECE specialization units and ECE 242

- 350 days of work experience, paid or volunteer



## Site Supervisor Permit

- AS (or 60 units) which includes units necessary to qualify for the Teacher Permit
- Plus ECE 240, ECE 241, ECE 242
- 350 days of work experience, including at least 100 days of supervising adults



## Program Director Permit

- BS which includes units necessary to qualify for the Site Supervisor Permit
- Site Supervisor status and one program year of Site Supervisor experience

\* For the permit, ECE classes cannot be applied to the GE requirements, though they can be applied to your degree and transfer.

\*\* You may take COOP 670 Cooperative Education/Work Experience for Early Childhood Education to complete volunteer and/or work hours in early childhood settings.
