Themes

- Folks are still confused about what CRM really is about?
- How do we add students sooner? (see notes on group 2)
- Students are connecting career exploration to interest areas.
- How does interest areas?

Group 1

- Confusion about the data coach and CRM (Salesforce?)
- How do we get involved at this point?
- Lorraine/Nick interested in getting involved in CRM

Group 2

- Great to have students!
- Piece that is not so clear is the connection between pathways and career
- Need to clear up the intention of Pathways; how to WELL-DEFINE the story and keep folks on track
- How to bring in students earlier to develop support teams (peer support)
- How do we link transferable skills to each pathway
- How can students in the same interest area chat with one another (possible BPA process?)

Group 3

- Embedded tutoring with students taking the same classes
- How can we get them into peer academic support by interest area sooner?
- Terms don't always make sense (embedded tutoring, supplemental instruction, etc.)
- Consistent institutionalized support for academic support and alignment with tutoring/class schedule

Group 4

- How do we leverage those individuals who were already on campus when FYE was first integrated into Cañada College
- How do we align timing of sorting students into interest areas at the right time for the best support for the students
- Need to integrate, collaborate, consolidate
- How do we engage and support students in their first year

#### Group 5

- Confusion around dual/concurrent enrollment and middle college
- How can we clarify definitions for faculty in order to enhance support for students
- Enhance marketing about early college experiences
- How are we communicating with and between high schools around needs and goals
- What is our goal w/expanding services to dual/concurrent and middle college students?

#### Group 6

- Really taking a decided look at what online education can look like for both the instructor and the student
- Elevating faculty experience with online so that we can improve the experience for students
- Where can students learn if they are prepared “enough” for online experiences

#### Group 7/8

- Career exploration clarity can support persistence
- Faculty would like to support workplace learning and yet do not know how to connect to these opportunities
