



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Congratulations to Samuel Trumble!

Samuel earned second place nationally for his research and presentation and won the Sloane Prize for Undergraduate Research at the <u>National</u> <u>Collegiate Honors Convention</u> in Chicago!

Samuel's research focuses on the 17th century folklore of Northeastern North America and the "Trickster Tales" of Algonquian and Iroquoian Native Americans, New England colonists, and enslaved African Americans. Samuel was mentored by Professor Michael Stanford and worked with research librarian Chris Burns. <u>For more information on Samuel's project click here</u>.

Samuel's paper, "The Trickster Archetype in North America" was also published in <u>Thinkyou?!</u>.

Here's a quote from Samuel on his experience:

The whole experience of creating this project and seeing it evolve into a published paper has really shown me what I am capable of. As a nontraditional student I am constantly doubting if school is really the right place for me. After going to Chicago for the NCHC conference and taking second place I have no doubt that I am on the right track to doing something truly significant. (Trumble, 2023)
