General Announcements-

Standing Updates

Participatory Governance Committees

- 1. Academic Committee for Equity and Success, Rebekah Taveau-Next meeting is on Tuesday, April 16th from 3:00-4:30 in 3-142. They will be updating their by-laws. Will talk about SEAP and will present a rough draft on April 25th. Comments will be taken in April and May. Filming for the equity video-Paul Naas proposed to do the filming on a Saturday but possibly will not have much participation on a Saturday. Rebekah's suggestion would be to do it on the Friday in May after the Division Meeting. The upcoming ACES event with Aisha Fukushima on May 7th is the last event of the Equity Series. They are putting it on pause in order to think deeply and reflect on the future.
- 2. Academic Senate-The State Academic Senate is visiting on April 25th from 1-3pm and discussing ways to improve relations with administrators and the structure of accreditation committees. It was discussed that Jackie Speier proposed renaming the college to "Mohr College" after Tom Mohr. Discussed was the confusion of Cañada College being in Canada and how it doesn't come up in a google search. It's a marketing concern. There was discussion about changing the name from a Hispanic name to a non-Hispanic name. The community would need to weigh in on this.
- 3. Curriculum Committee- Julie Carey and Lezlee Ware-Lezlee talked about an "efficiency clause" and making small changes voted on all at once in a consent agenda. Also, adding in the fall a "Zoom Option" will be available for those who are unable to attend in person. It is preferable that you attend in person if you have an agenda item.
- 4. Distance Education Advisory Committee, Lezlee Ware-Those who have completed the online

training will receive a stipend including adjunct faculty. Question about being recertified to teach online. Discussion is for retraining every 3 years which would be consistent with the state. Net Tutor the online tutoring has been effective offering tutoring for Math, English and Science. They will customize support for other disciplines.
