Why This Matters

We want students to:

- Finish in two years
- Get the classes they need
- Avoid scheduling conflicts
- Have more than one chance to start or continue
- See clear pathways to completion

At the same time, we must:

- Stay within our FTEF allocation

2.1.1 One-Year Course Schedule

Action Step 2.1.1: Create a one-year course schedule.

Status:  | 10% Complete

This work is currently paused.

Why?

- Transition to a new curriculum system
- Banner upgrade
- AB 928 and AB 1111 implementation
- Need for districtwide alignment

We do not want to rush this work and risk errors.
We will resume once major systems stabilize.

2.1.2 Hybrid Short-Term & Late-Start Courses

Action Step 2.1.2: Evaluate and offer hybrid short-term and late-start courses (e.g., mini-mester).

Status:  | Embedded & Ongoing

We:

- Evaluated and offered mini-mester and late-start options
- Reduced scheduling bottlenecks
- Increased student flexibility within term

2.1.4 Online Degrees & Certificates

Action Step 2.1.4: Continue to assess our course offerings to determine the feasibility of online degrees and certificates.

Status:  | Embedded & Ongoing

We:

- Reviewed modality each semester during schedule development
- Reviewed data: enrollment, fill rate, load for past two years
- Planned two-year pathway (online & hybrid)
- Published completion pathways with Marketing

Students can clearly see how to finish—including fully online degrees.

2.1.6 Key Courses in Multiple Modalities

Action Step 2.1.6: Offer key courses (e.g., popular, commonly needed General Education courses) in multiple instructional modalities.

Status:  | Embedded & Ongoing

We:

- Monitored GE access across modalities
- Reviewed Program Complete-Ability Dashboard
- Aligned with counselors and SEP data
- Strategically rotated modalities across terms
