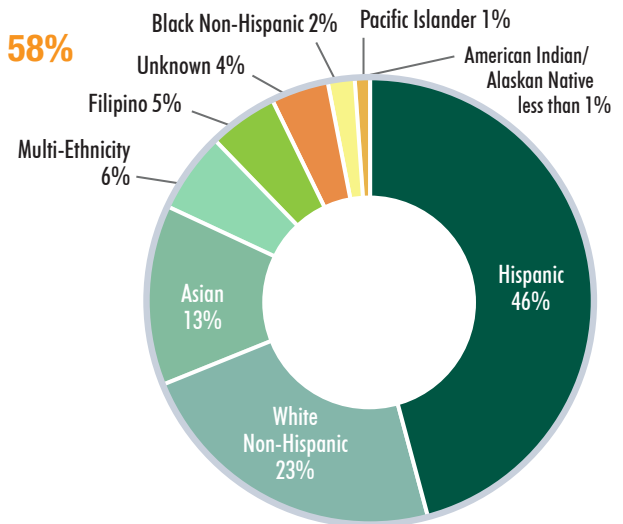
FALL 2024 STUDENT PROFILE

GENDER



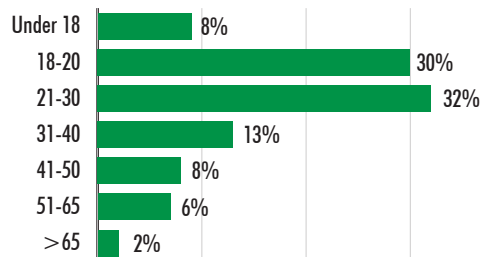

AGE



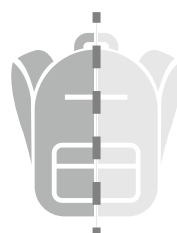
FALL 2024 ENROLLMENT

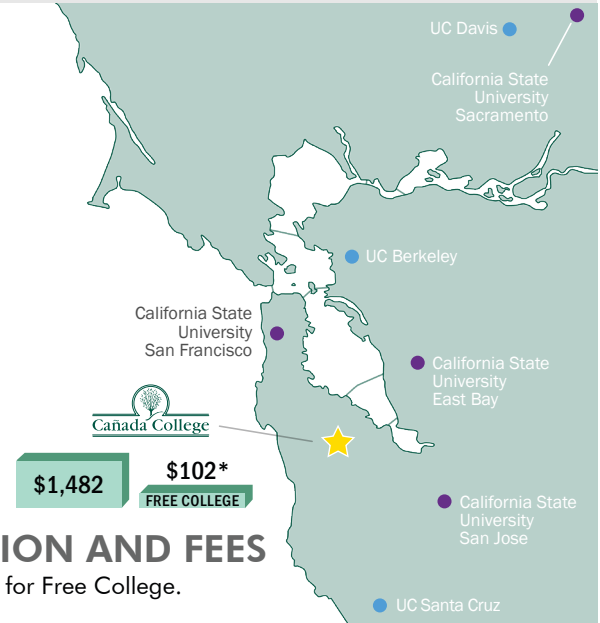
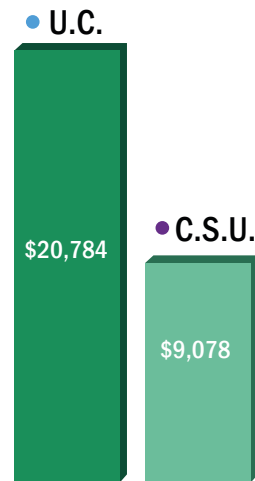
