Cañada College Radiologic Technology second year student Jeannie Sanders received First Place for her scientific display at the California Society of Radiologic Technologists (CSRT) annual conference. In addition, Jeannie also won the clinical excellence scholarship awarded by the CSRT and her paper, "Tips for Radiographers: The Use of Trigonometric and Geometric Principles to Simplify Axial and Tangential Projections" has been accepted for publication in the *American Society of Radiologic Technologists Journal*, the scholarly publication of the ASRT with more than 145,000 readers worldwide.
