Program Review -- Personnel Resource Request Timeline

A reminder that Monday, October 21 is the deadline to submit [Program Review](#) as well as resource and [personnel requests](#). The [Cañada College Participatory Governance Manual](#) delineates the process for requesting, prioritizing, and approving position requests. As of fall 2018, all resource requests are made as part of the Program Review process and submitted in Improve (TracDat) along with all other data, narratives, and required forms. To request new positions, as distinct from replacement hires, programs must complete and attach to their program review submittal in TracDat the appropriate personnel request form:

- Form to request a [new faculty position](#)

Program Review – Position Request Presentations

Programs requesting new positions as part of their program review cycle are invited to make a presentation to the campus community on October 30, 31, or November 1 between 2-4 p.m. All position requests should be submitted in Improve (formerly TracDat). Position proposal documents should be attached to the action plan that relates to the need for the position. Positions should also be entered as resource requests. SMCCD Fall 2019 Promise Scholars Program Leadership Convening

Cañada College's Promise Scholars Program (PSP) staff and leadership team joined our SMCCCD PSP colleagues in the Fall 2019 Leadership Convening with our City University of New York (CUNY) Accelerated Studies in Associates Programs (ASAP) partners. This convening was hosted at Skyline College (October 17 – 18) and focused on the role of PSP counseling within the CUNY ASAP integration timeline. The convening was a vital component of the PSP Replication project which is funded by the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office (CCCO) Awards for Innovation in Higher Education grant. Our SMCCCD colleges were also joined by Cuesta College, Lake Tahoe Community College, and Pasadena City College leadership teams who are also planning for replication of the PSP at their respective campuses.
