Leadership Retreat Outcomes

On August 12 & 13, more than 50 student, faculty, and classified staff leaders and administrators joined together for Cañada's second annual Leadership Retreat. Held on Zoom this year, the event involved participants from every stakeholder group that is part of the College's [participatory governance framework](#). The group tackled the challenges and opportunities facing the College due to the COVID-19 pandemic and renewed the College's commitment to being an anti-racist institution. Anti-Racism at Cañada College

Following the murder of George Floyd on May 25, the Cañada campus community embarked on a series of conversations and strategic planning activities to fulfill the [College Mission, Vision and Values](#), the [District's commitment to social justice](#) and [President Moore's statement in support of Black Lives Matter](#). In addition to the Leadership Retreat (above), a Flex Day Session that Continued the Discussion begun at the Retreat was held on August 18 (see here for the [slides](#) and [notes](#) from that session). In addition, the College hosted three [Critical Conversations](#) about Race over the summer and intends to continue to do so all year as we read
