Thank You, Ruth, and Happy Retirement!

Please join me in congratulating our Registrar, Ruth Miller, on a very successful 45 ½ years of service at SMCCCD. Ruth retires at the end of this month. Ruth began working in the San Mateo County Community College District on September 1, 1975, where she accepted a Cashier's position at Skyline College. Her office was located in the Box Office where she would sell tickets to the many performances at the time, process the Community Education registrations, coordinate the Facilities rentals and take care of the Associated Students Accounts. In 1975, computers were not used and everything was done via paper and pen and all student interactions were done face-to-face.

In 1989, Ruth took a detail position in Human Resources where she took care of all aspects of the employees at Cañada. The assignment lasted almost nine months. Shortly after her detail assignment was over, she applied, and was hired, for the A&R III position in the Cañada College Admissions' Office. As part of her position, she was in charge of all applications and registrations. Ruth mentioned that, in those days, the application and registration process was done via mail, over the phone and in-person. She remembers that the lines during in-person registration ran from the cafeteria, past Room 2-10 and down toward the parking lot. During the in-person registration period, Ruth and her team would work until everyone in line was served by 9 p.m. Sometimes, they would not get off work until 11 p.m.!

In 1994, a new position was created in the Admissions and Record's Office - Assistant Registrar. Ruth applied for and was hired for this new position. For many years, she served the College in this role overseeing all aspects of Admissions. A number of years back, the Assistant Registrar title was changed to Registrar, which is her title today. Ruth has shared that she has many fond memories working for the District and Cañada serving students during the past 45 ½ years. Cañada has been a second family to her, especially in Admissions and Records, where she has made life-long friends.

From all of us at Cañada, we thank you for your 45 ½ years of supporting students and our community and wish you a restful retirement. We look forward to celebrating you (along with other employees who retired during the pandemic) in person when it is safe to gather and celebrate.
