Economic Outlook and Resource Request Process for 2021-22



During its meeting on October 7, 2020, the Cañada Planning & Budgeting Council (PBC) considered information regarding the region's [Economic Outlook](#) and its implications for the College's fiscal year 2021-22 budget and beyond. This followed a campus-wide email from President Moore, sent on September 25, 2020, indicating that the COVID-19 pandemic and recent state-wide wildfires continue to threaten our economic future. While the College's Annual Update and Resource Request Process for the next fiscal year will continue, College stakeholders are encouraged to review the [Economic Outlook](#) and be aware that funding next year and the ensuing years may be severely constrained. PBC Adopts Annual Plan for 2020-21

At its October 7, 2020 meeting, the Planning & Budgeting Council (PBC) adopted and forwarded to Dr. Moore for adoption and implementation, an [Annual Plan for 2020-21](#). This Plan sets forth the activities to be implemented this academic year to support the achievement of the College's 5-year goals articulated in the College [Education Master Plan](#) as well as other key college plans such as the [Strategic Enrollment Management Plan](#).

A Place for Our Students: Multi-Cultural Center Space

The Multi-Cultural Center space on campus will be located on the upper-campus level adjacent to the International Student Program. In review of the plans for the International Student Program, the Multi-Cultural Center has been part of the space allocation in order for students to have a safe space to congregate on the upper campus in Building 9 where many of the Student Support Services are located. In addition to the space, the College will have a prayer room that will be available for students who require that needed privacy. The space identified for the Multi-Cultural Center is in Building 9, Room 154B. It is 1,062 square feet. From the plans listed, the Art Gallery will also be adjacent in addition to the space for CIETL which is separate from the Multi-Cultural Center space. Please take a moment and review both the (attached) PowerPoint and the clip from the [Facilities Forum](#) (Passcode: 0MVWx^.) that took place on September 24, 2020. These are among the various construction and space planning projects reviewed at the Facilities Forum. Please stay tuned for updates about next steps in this important planning before the end of the Fall 2020.
