Drive-Up WiFi

On Monday, September 14, Cañada College joined College of San Mateo and Skyline College in launching Drive-Up WiFi that is free and accessible from our college parking lots. The new “Drive-Up Wi-Fi” service allows students to park in a specially designated parking lot on the campus of their choice, where they can access Wi-Fi to attend their online classes or do their schoolwork. Reservations are required for entry. Students can select the campus that is most convenient. Each student will need to complete the Eventbrite reservation form, print or download their Eventbrite ticket, and follow the instructions for entry to the campus. How to Be an Antiracist, Dr. Ibram X. Kendi


