Spring Enrollments


The College continues to monitor enrollments closely for Spring term. The “point in time” report is attached which shows how enrollments compare to this time in the term one year ago. That report shows overall enrollments down 10.6% compared to this time last year. By instructional modality, our online synchronous sections are 42% full; online asynchronous are 39% full; our hybrid sections are 25% full and our face-to-face sections are 22% full. We are still early in the enrollment process and expect to see more enrollments after the holiday break.

To support our enrollment efforts, Cañada will launch targeted social media advertising to promote that the campus is open for in-person, hybrid and virtual classes as well as the re-launch of our campus shuttle service. Also, more than 50,000 post card mailers were sent to residents in East Palo Alto, Menlo Park and Palo Alto, announcing the shuttle service. In addition, Cañada, CSM and Skyline will continue collaboration on a districtwide enrollment campaign to stem enrollment declines at all three colleges. This will be achieved by expanding on its previous campaigns with segmented messages to our underrepresented populations promoting basic needs support, free transportation and free college through the Promise Scholars Program. Platforms for the digital marketing campaign include: Facebook, Instagram, YouTube, Snapchat, Spotify, etc. as well as a series of postcard mailers that will reach all 280,000 homes in San Mateo County.

SamTrans to Launch Pilot Program to Give Free Rides to Low-Income Students

SamTrans, in partnership with the San Mateo County Office of Education, is launching a six-month pilot program to offer free fares to low-income students. SamTrans is creating passes that will be given to school districts to distribute to qualified students, giving passholders free rides on all SamTrans bus routes through June 2022, at which time a

2. Click on the "COVID-19 Vaccination" link at the top of the page and select one of the options below:
3. Select "Fully vaccinated"

Enter requested vaccine information AND upload a digital copy (jpeg, tiff, or pdf) of vaccination card or California digital vaccination record.
