### **The Unlocking Futures Fellowship (UFF)**

The Unlocking Futures Fellowship (UFF) is a new opportunity that was launched this academic year to provide undocumented students scholarships and mentorship as they develop their professional, leadership and academic skills. Recently, Unlocking Futures Fellow Luis Romero led a presentation for 15 fellow students in English and Spanish covering what the Cañada College Scholarship is and how undocumented students can benefit from it. During the event, students asked many questions and this was the first of a series of events he will host in order to support more undocumented students in accessing crucial resources to continue their education.



### **Cañada Hosts Campus Visit for 70+ Dual Enrolled Woodside High School Students**

In the Spring 2024 semester, an impressive cohort of 100 Woodside High School students will be dual-enrolled in our History 202 class. As part of their academic journey, these students recently participated in a field trip to campus where more than 70 students engaged with distinguished speakers such as Dean James Carranza, college instructor Justin Coburn and current college students. The trip left a lasting impression on our students, as reflected in their responses.

One student shared, "It got me really interested in learning more about what Cañada can offer me. The flexibility of it especially." Another highlighted the value of the student panel, stating, "I enjoyed the student panel because the panel was very informing, and those students all had different answers and experiences." Lastly, a student expressed the excitement of reconnecting with the alumni, saying, "It was cool to see former Woodside students and say hi." These activities are meant to broaden our students' horizons and fuel a strong interest in learning that goes beyond the classroom. We expect a semester where students experience significant progress, meaningful exploration and a dedication to doing well in their classes.



### **LibreTexts' ADAPT Workshops**

Last Friday, Cañada College hosted one of LibreTexts' ADAPT workshops. A total of 18 faculty from various CSUs and community colleges, including many from Cañada College, joined in the event. These workshops were held across the state for any faculty who were interested in learning more about this versatile and free-to-students platform. Dr. Delmar Larsen of UC Davis, the founder and director of LibreTexts, came to teach faculty about the LibreTexts homework and assessment platform, guiding everyone in creating questions, building assignments and connecting everything to Canvas. Course materials, both for textbooks and homework platforms, are a significant cost for students. Through ADAPT, faculty can use Open Educational Resources (OER) for homework and other assignments, adding another way to drastically reduce the amount that students pay for course materials. 
## Boba and Paint De-Stress
