OER/ZTC Financial Impact, Fall 2023

Our Open Educational Resources (OER) and Zero Textbook Cost (ZTC) team recently shared impressive full enrollment data for our ZTC and Low Textbook Cost LTC courses:

- 3,700 students enrolled at census into ZTC and LTC courses (*record!*)
- ZTC: 68 courses, 108 sections (*record for both!*)
- LTC: 12 courses, 19 sections (not a record, but strong)
- 59 unique faculty (out of 188, or 31.383%--*record!*)
- Estimated savings: \$343,500 (*record!*)
