The San Mateo County Community College District has selected four finalists for its chancellor position. This announcement comes after a national search that fielded a highly qualified and diverse pool of candidates. A screening committee comprised of faculty, staff, students, administrators, a board member and a community representative has recommended four candidates to the Board of Trustees for consideration. Each candidate participated in a recorded forum, which can be viewed on the Chancellor Finalists & Forums site.

The SMCCCD Board of Trustees encourages you to watch the forum recordings to hear directly from the finalists about their preparation and vision for leading our District. Dr. Anniqua Rana, Dean of Academic Support and Learning Technologies (ASLT)

Please congratulate Dr. Anniqua Rana who has been selected as Cañada's permanent Dean of Academic Support and Learning Technologies (ASLT), pending board

approval. Dr. Rana as she started at Cañada as an ESL Faculty member in 1998 and later served as Dean of Athletics, Library and Learning Center (ALL), which is now the ASLT division. She has served as Interim Dean of ASLT since August 2023.

For more than 30 years, Dr. Rana has been dedicated to equity in higher education. Her doctoral research focused on the implications of technology for women of Pakistan in higher education. She has worked as an educational administrator and consultant in the US and Pakistan. She has taught English as a Second Language, English, Creative Writing, and Multicultural Education at Cañada College, College of San Mateo, University of San Francisco, Lahore University of Management Sciences, UC Santa Cruz extension, and Stanford University.

Dr. Rana grew up between Pakistan and the UK and immigrated to the US in 1989. When she's not working as an administrator, she writes. Her debut novel, Wild Boar in the Cane Field was shortlisted for Pakistan's UBL Literary Award, 2020. She blogs on Tillism.com- Tillism: Magical Words from around the World. Her writings on gender and education have appeared in TNS, Naya Daur TV, International Education, Ravi Magazine, Bangalore Review, Fourteen Hills, The Noyo River Review, Delay Fiction, Listening to the Voices: Multi-ethnic Women in Education, and other publications. She is currently working on a travel memoir: That These Should be Lies: Tilting at Windmills.

Dr. Rana received her Ed.D in International and Multicultural Education from University of San Francisco, MA in English Literature from San Jose State University, MA in English and Linguistics from University of the Punjab, Pakistan, BA in Philosophy, English Literature, and Arabic from University of the Punjab, Pakistan and Certificate TESOL from UC Berkeley Extension.

Cañada and SMCCCD Undocu Coalition to Present at National Conference

Exciting news! Our SMCCCD Undocu Coalition was recently accepted to present a fullday pre-conference at the National Conference for Race & Ethnicity in Higher Education (NCORE) in Hawaii from May 28 through June 1, 2024. Additional sessions outside of the pre-conference schedule may also include presentations from Cañada College, Skyline College and the College of San Mateo. This presentation opportunity celebrates a few groundbreaking moments for Cañada College and SMCCCD. For example, NCORE has featured very few pre-conferences that have been entirely focused on community college issues. This marks the first time that our District has presented as part of the pre-conference schedule and the first time that our undocumented student support efforts are shared nationally. In addition, NCORE has never featured an institution that has solely focused on undocumented student support. This is a first for NCORE to have a pre-conference session fully hosted by a community college district on this topic!
