SLO/Assessment Retreat Emphasizes Clarity, Support and Streamlined Processes

On June 10, SLO (Student Learning Outcomes) Coordinator Paul Roscelli, along with Division Leads Katie Schertle, Nick Martin and Hyla Lacefield, joined David Eck, Lindsey Irizarry and Anniqua Rana for an SLO/Assessment Retreat to plan action steps for Summer and Fall 2025 in support of program mapping and accreditation efforts. The retreat focused on clarifying faculty responsibilities for SLO and PLO (Program Learning Outcomes) assessment, enhancing communication and onboarding and identifying programs in need of targeted support. Attendees explored strategies to streamline tools like Nuventive - such as updating user roles, integrating program review content and improving access to reporting features. The Social Sciences, ESL and Library Departments were commended for their progress. The team reaffirmed a shared commitment to supporting faculty, honoring their time, and fostering a culture of continuous improvement. The guiding principle: minimize busywork, maximize meaningful work.
