

General Information on the CCCCO Grants

CCCCO Zero-cost Pathways Grants

Phase 1

- \$20,000/college
- 'By apportionment' (= guaranteed)
- Meant to help plan for Phase 3
- Work to be done by June 30, 2023
- Cañada has received this funding as of November 2022.

Phase 3

• \$180,000

- 'By apportionment' (= guaranteed), so long as the college submits for Phase 1
- Creation of zero-cost ADTs and Certificates
 of Achievement
- Certification should open Q2 of 2023

Note: Phase 2 funding has been shelved as of 18 November 2022; more info in 2023.

Important Information re: CCCCO ZTC Grants

- Colleges are to develop new or existing ADT/Certificate of Achievement zero-cost programs.
 - Focus on high-value programs AND/OR meets an emerging regional business industry need AND/OR those with high textbook costs
- 'Course materials' are defined in <u>California Community College Education Code</u> <u>78052(b)(5)</u>.
- These funds can be used for professional development and technical assistance.
- Pathways and hiring are determined locally.
- Everything must be able to be institutionalized after the funding has run out.
- Academic Senate is to be consulted with respect to implementation of the Pathways.

Important Information re: CCCCO ZTC Grants

- Pathways must include:
 - Core courses
 - Selectives
 - GEs
- Programs need to offer as many sections as possible for each course as ZTC.
- The materials adopted, remixed or authored must be accessible and customizable (CC-BY, CC-BY-NC).
- ADT/Certificate Pathways should be implemented within 3 academic years of receiving funding, if not sooner.

Cañada's Plans for the CCCCO ZTC Grants

Phase 1: \$20,000 (Received Nov. 2022)

- Spring 2023 cohort of ZTC Adopter Program (4-5 projects)
 - \$500 for training
 - \$750 for adoption; \$2,000 for remix
 - Focus on GE courses not already converted
- Funding for Library resources (e.g. eBooks, subscriptions)
- OER/ZTC Training for Embedded Tutors and Peer Mentors—On-going
- Fall 2022 ZTC/LTC Student Survey—Launched, Data being analyzed
 - What's working well?
 - What are the needs/challenges?

Phase 3: \$180,000 (Coming 2023)

- Expanding to as many ZTC Pathways (both ADTs and Certificates) as possible
 - Likely candidates include ANTH, COMM, ECE, PHYS, MATH (they're the most ready right now)
 - Want to engage all departments in this work
 - Funds to expand ZTC Adoption Program to fall, spring and summer
- Addressing the student needs (data from student engagement work in Phase 1)
- Further funding for more Library resources (e.g. eBooks, subscriptions)
- Further training for faculty and students, including improving Canvas-based training
- ZTC Division Coaches (to allow for more projects to be funded throughout this process)
- Opportunity for faculty to author, not just remix/adopt
