



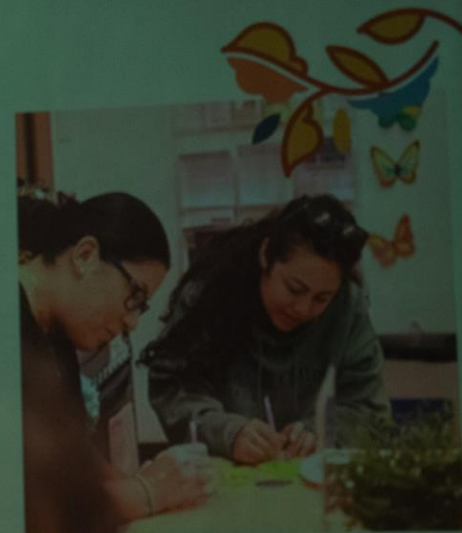

- Goal: Ensure PD remains equitable, accessible, and impactful.


