Note: SRTK, or Student Right-to-Know, is a "cohort" study; that is, a group of students who are first-time freshmen, who are enrolled full-time in a fall term, and are degree-, certificate-, or transfer-seeking. Their outcomes are measured over a period of time. The outcomes that the two SRTK rates measure are Completion and Transfer.

For institutions offering 2-year degrees, Completion is measured as the total number of students in the cohort who earn either a degree, a certificate, or who successfully complete 60 transferable units with a gpa of 2.0 or better. Transfer is measured as the total number of cohort non-completers who are identified as having enrolled in another institution. The tracking period of the cohorts is three (3) years, at which time the SRTK rates are calculated and made public.

For institutions offering 4-year degrees, Completion is measured as the total number of students in the cohort who earn either a degree, a certificate, or are "transfer prepared," defined as having completed 60 transferable units with a gpa of 2.0 or better. Transfer is measured as the total number of student who transfer to another post-secondary institution prior to attaining a degree, certificate, or becoming "transfer prepared." The tracking period of the cohorts is six (6) years. For Skyline College, the fall 2018 cohort is the first to be measured under the 4-year methodology.

SRTK has its merits in that it attempts to provide a standardized measure of college effectiveness nationwide. However, in order to fully understand what SRTK rates mean for a college, one should also know its limitations. First, the cohort group can be quite small compared to the entire community college population, and is therefore not fully representative of all educational activities at a college. Many community colleges do not have the primary mission of producing only transferable students. The metrics also do not account for student outcomes occurring after the tracking period.

SRTK Rates are derived and reported yearly on the IPEDS-GRS, Integrated Postsecondary Educational Data System-Graduation Rate Survey). The IPEDS-GRS also tracks part-time student cohorts over a six (6) year period; however, full-time cohort status after 3 years is the only basis for calculating SRTK rates.
