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Land and Labor Acknowledgement	Aarya	2
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We acknowledge that Cañada College is situated on the traditional unceded land of the Ramaytush (Rah-my-toosh) Ohlone (Oh-LOW-nee) peoples, and we respect our past elders and honor the present community. Long before Cañada College existed, this area was home to the Ramaytush Ohlone peoples, who still have a presence in the Bay Area today.

We have a responsibility to acknowledge that we as a Cañada community have benefited from the use and occupation of this land and that the tragic legacy of colonization, genocide, capitalism, racism, and oppression still impacts people today.

We also recognize the labor upon which this educational institution, state, and country is built.

We acknowledge the peoples of African ancestry who were enslaved and forcibly brought to this land, and whose forced labor played a major role in the formation of this country. We are indebted to their uncompensated labor and their unwilling sacrifice over hundreds of years—which continues to impact generations today. We honor the legacy of the African diaspora and the continued contribution of their survivors.

We acknowledge the contributions of all immigrant labor, forced labor, and undocumented people who contributed, and continue to contribute, to the building and feeding of this land. We acknowledge their immeasurable sacrifices and work that allow us to gather in this space today.

Let us not forget. Let us honor and engage with the people who have stewarded and labored on this land for generations, and let us honor these truths—by taking responsibility as a college community to continually educate ourselves about these realities, to affirm our commitment to justice through continual action, and to protect and sustain this land.

We would like to feature a Womxn of Color during AANHPI Heritage Month and also feature her because our Pacific Islander students are disproportionately impacted at our college. <p><i>The Women of Color Collaborative (WOCC) requested additional funding to support two initiatives: an Ocean Healing Workshop led by the founder of the Tahitian Cultural Center and justice-focused speakers and healing activities. WOCC currently operates on a \$4,000 annual budget while hosting two events per month with ~25 attendees each, serving all students. The workshop centers Native Hawaiian and Pacific Islander students, a highly underrepresented group on campus with high attrition, and requires funding for travel, cultural materials, and logistics, with partial support from the Cultural Center and Alumni of Color Collaborative. WOCC is also requesting funds for event food sourced from women-owned and local small businesses to align with its equity and community investment values. <p><i>The team requested funding to attend the National Student Leadership Diversity Conference (NSLDC) in Atlanta, FL, April 17–19, the largest national gathering of student leaders and advisors addressing diversity and social justice through workshops, keynotes, and campus action-planning sessions that students will bring back to Cañada. Early registration is \$249 by March 28 (then \$299, \$329 after), round-trip flights average \$486, hotel costs \$636 (4 nights, Apr 16–20), and per diem totals \$70/day per person. Estimated costs scale by group size (about \$3,040 for one student and one advisor). Several students and a Cultural Center representative are interested, and an expedited decision is requested to secure lower rates, as NSLDC is replacing NCORE, which has been canceled. Shanda motions to approve \$10,000 for food, flights, transportation, hotel, registration, any needed accomodations or unforeseen costs for 4 students and 1 advisor to go towards the National Leadership Diversity Convention from April 16 through the 20th, 2026, from the ASCC Professional Development Account.
