Land and Labor Acknowledgement:		Shanda		3	
We acknowledge that Cañada College is situated on the traditional unceded land of the Ramaytush (Rah-my-toosh) Ohlone (Oh-LOW-nee) peoples, and we respect our past elders and honor the present community. Long before Cañada College existed, this area was home to the Ramaytush Ohlone peoples, who still have a presence in the Bay Area today.					
We have a responsibility to acknowledge that we as a Cañada community have benefited from the use and occupation of this land and that the tragic legacy of colonization, genocide, capitalism, racism, and oppression still impacts people today.

We are indebted to their uncompensated labor and their unwilling sacrifice over hundreds of years—which continues to impact generations today. We acknowledge the contributions of all immigrant labor, forced labor, and undocumented people who contributed, and continue to contribute, to the building and feeding of this land. We acknowledge their immeasurable sacrifices and work that allow us to gather in this space today.					
Let us not forget. Let us honor and engage with the people who have stewarded and labored on this land for generations, and let us honor these truths—by taking responsibility as a college community to continually educate ourselves about these realities, to affirm our commitment to justice through continual action, and to protect and sustain this land.

Field Trip and Guest Speaker Events For Latinx Heritage Month - Funding request \$4,500			Joshua	10	
Joshua requests money for four events throughout the semester and would like ASCC sponsoring these events. The first event will consist of the LatinX kickoff, the next trip would be at two community Gardens in SF, Black and Filpinix textile artist (90 minute presentation, Q&As after). Lastly, there would be a self-care workshop centered around indigenious and native practices. Introduces us into fields beyond the classroom and deepen our cultural understanding. Joshua shares the budget breakdown, and he is requesting \$4,500. Kharittas commends how thoughtful this event sens. Chanel asks what is the marketing plan to advertise this event. Joshua says after approval, they will partner with different departments to advertise this. This event would be open to everyone in the school, and there would be around 12 students maximum. They are thinking of going on this event during flex day. Alexis suggested doing this event on a Saturday to better plan this event and create opportunities for all students to join. Joshua said he would check in with Chris. Shanda motions to add 3 minutes. Neve seconds. This motion passes with all votes in favor. Shanda asks that if the event falls under a week day, can Joshua and Sergio rotate so that the student life center stays open and is open for students. Lamar moves to allocate \$4500 towards the Latinx Heritage Month Guest SPeaker Events and Field trip to be used by December 5, 2026. Shanda seconds. National Collegiate Honors Council (NCHC) 60th Anniversary Conference -Funding Request \$11,491.40			Rebekah Taveau	10	

Rebekah Taveau discusses the National Collegiate Honors Conference. Jenia describes NCHC and it will have honors lectures, student presentations, lectures and workshops, networking events, and 3 Cañada students will present. NCHC is a national conference for undergraduate and graduate students, builds up Cañada's reputation and relationships between other students from other schools, and a wonderful opportunity to learn from others and how to research and bring it back to Cañada. Mohammed describes who will be going on this trip. They will be presenting on the uses and misuses of AI and learn ways to help students. The trip Itinerary takes place from November 12th to November 15th. Jane says that the total ask is \$12,662. Alexis shared that the funding requests says \$11,491.40. Shanda asks if the hotel price includes everyone getting their own room and shares that we don't do seperate rooms. Shanda motions to add 5 more minutes. Kharittas seconds. This motion passes with all votes in favor. Ms. Taveau shares that 2 women can share theor own room. Chanel asks if we have reached out to the foundation and Ms. Taveau says there is no other foundation that has provided money. Kharittas asks if the rest of Cañada college students can see this presentation. Ms. Taveau said she will come back to the next ASCC meeting and share there and will also share it at the Honors Research Showcase that is open to all Cañada College. Chanel asks if this budget can come out of the Vending Comission. Shanda shares that we should be considerate of other programs and approving this would use half of our budget. The vending comission application is different than the ASCC requests. Ms. Tavaeu shares the various ways she is trying to save money. Ms. Taveau says that if we do not register by monday, then the presentations will be cancelled. The motion to table this item does not pass. Lamar seconds. 1 person voted to table this item, 4 opposed this motion, and 0 abstain. Shanda motions to approve \$21650 which covers the registration fee to be used by August 31st and table the rest to be finalized in the next meeting on September 3, 2026. This motion passess with all votes in favor.			
BSU + NANDI Conference - Funding Request \$10,400	Candice Johnson + Dr. Kassie Alexander	10	
Candice Johnson shares that BSU is asking for funding to go to NANDI and the theme is "Sombodys got to do it." It is a 2-day conference and the remaining 2 days will be used to visit one of the school campuses (SDSU or UC San Diego). Thursday October 1st, and Friday October 2 and it ends at 12 pm. 1 student requests having their own room. 4 rooms would accomodate 2 advisors and 4 students. There would be 6 round trip flights. Candice shares that since Senate has limited funds, so she asks for student senate to cover the 4 students and then BSU will cover the two advisors. Shanda shares that the \$4000 from BSU from club asistance can cover the 2 advisors and then Student Senate can cover the rest. Sergio clarifies that when a club submits a funding request, anything over \$499 goes to ASCC. This would come out of club asistance and the rest out of professional development. Shanda asks if it can be payed for through student senate. Sergio shares that per our bylaws, we can decide which 4 students get to go. Shanda would like to nominate herself and Chanel because ever since Shanda met Chanel, Chanel has advocated hard for her friends and fellow African Americans and would love for her to attend and gain more information to bring back to elevate our Black student voices. Shanda moves to add 5 more minutes. Kharittas seconds. This motion passess with all votes in favor. Shanda moves to nominate Shanda and Chanel to go to the NANDI conference with BSU. Bianca seconds. This motion passes with 5 votes in favor. None opposed, and one abstain. Shanda moves for ASCC to fund for 4 students to go to NANDI and BSU govers the 2 advisors to be used byu October. Chanel amends this motion to be used from Professional Development and Club asistance and allocates \$10,400. Shanda moves to add 5 more minutes. Lamar seconds. This motion passess with all votes in favor. Shanda moves to allocate \$6,378 to be used from the Professional Development Account to be used by October 31st and \$4000 to be used from the Club Asisstance by October 31st and ammends the motion to add a presentation date of October 15, 2026 and BSU and Student Senate will present a follow up on the event. Shanda ammends the motion to include Chanel, Shanda, Elizabeth, and Ebony as the four students and the 4 advisors will be Candice and Dr. Kassi for the NANDI Conference for September 30 to October 3, 2026.
