Basic vs. Selection Requirements

Basic:

All UC campuses require the same basic admission criteria that all applicants must meet:

- Have 7 course pattern
- Be in Junior standing
- Minimum GPA of 2.4 (non-residents 2.8)

Selective:

Programs with more applicants than space available will be selective. This means the program requires additional criteria in addition to the basic admission requirements.

- Overall GPA (usually higher than the basic requirements)
- GPA for Major Prep courses
- Completion of major prep courses
- IGETC (some programs)
- Holistic Review (students background, where they live, income level, single parent, military, etc.)

Comprehensive Review

- Grade Point Average in all transferrable courses
- Completion of courses to meet major preparation
- Completion of courses to meet breadth requirements
- Participation in academic honors courses or programs
- Completion of an Associate Degree for Transfer offered by a California Community College
- Special Talents, Achievements, and awards
- Completion of Special Projects
- Academic Accomplishment Within Life Experiences
- Geographic Location

What to expect





The University of California requires all applicants to complete a Statement of Legal Residence (SLR) to be evaluated for a Residency Classification for purposes of UC tuition. For further explanation, read the full [UC Residence Policy and Guidelines](#). As UC policy is subject to change during the year, if there are any discrepancies between any Statement of Legal Residence and the Residence Policy and Guidelines, the Residence Policy and Guidelines govern the rules around Residence for Tuition purposes at all times.

The University of California's Statement of Legal Residence is made up of three parts: Physical presence, Intent to remain in California, and Immigration status.

- 1) Physical Presence - You and your parents must be physically present in California for more than 365 days immediately prior to the residence determination date. If you moved to California primarily to attend the University of California or another school, you are ineligible for a Resident classification for tuition purposes.
- 2) Intent to remain in California - You and your parents must have established your intent to make California your permanent home for more than 365 days immediately prior to the residence determination date and must have relinquished ties to any prior place of residence outside of California. Please read the [UC Residence Policy and Guidelines](#) to learn more about how to document your intent to remain in California.
- 3) Immigration status - You and your parents must be citizens or permanent residents of the United States, or be present under a valid I-94 for an eligible visa, and have held that immigration status for more than 365 days prior to the residence determination date.

In some cases, applicants who do not satisfy all three parts above may qualify for a Special Circumstances, Exemption, or Waiver provision (such as an AB 540 nonresident supplemental tuition exemption) and will be asked to submit additional supplemental information at a future date. A full list of exemptions and waivers can be found in the [UC Residence Policy and Guidelines](#).

- Accomplishments
- How they face challenges and opportunities
- How they impact their communities (on and off campus)

Personal Insight Questions -Tips

- Compose the responses outside of the application
- Start early, get feedback, and revise
 - Request feedback from teachers, counselors, parents and/or friends
- Define your motivation in topics that you are passionate about
- Avoid common mistakes

Introduction

The personal insight questions are about getting to know you better — your life experience, interests, ambitions and inspirations. Think of it as your interview with the admissions office. Be open. Be reflective. Find your individual voice and express it.

There are no right or wrong answers to these questions. They are about you and your life thus far.

A few tips:

- Present your information and ideas in a focused, thoughtful manner. Making a list of accomplishments, activities, awards or work will lessen the impact of your words.
- Use specific, concrete examples to support the points you want to make. Focus your examples on the present and near past.
- Tell us about yourself. We want to know about your personal triumphs or challenges, leadership opportunities and experiences outside the classroom.
- Use your own voice. Your answers should reflect your ideas and be written by you alone. Use "I" and "my" statements in your responses.
- Try to relax. There are many pieces of information we consider in reviewing your application; an admission decision will not be based on your responses alone.
